A New Chapter *Pastor's Report*

As we come to the end of this fiscal year, I want to take a moment to reflect on all that God has done in and through our church. This has been a year of deep challenge, intentional rebuilding, and renewed vision. After walking through a painful season of loss and transition, we've witnessed God's faithfulness as He begins to restore what was broken and breathe new life into our church community.

Financial Audit

Financial Review Findings for November 2024 Statements and books for Family Community Church and Wesleyan Kiddie Kollege

On May 7th, 2025, Angel Kuehn and Danielle Wagner did a random review of November 2024 financials. We found that the statements balanced, and documentation provided matched what was shown on statements, check stubs and receipts. There were no discrepancies found, however, some suggestions on staying more organized moving forward indicated by bullet points below:

- Turn in all receipts to the bookkeeper at the point of purchase.
- Turn in documentation for recurring monthly subscriptions:
 - Procare
 - ADP
 - Church track
 - Peace catalyst
 - Protect my Ministry
- Print and turn in monthly ADP and Tuition Express reports to turn into bookkeeper.
- Allow access to STRIPE to the bookkeeper.
- It would be helpful to have print outs of returned checks from Wesleyan Kiddie Kollege.
- Ask the bank for check images with the monthly statement.

*Please note that neither Angel Kuehn or Danielle Wagner are CPAs, nor do they work for an accounting firm. Angel has over 20 years of experience working in an accounting capacity for large companies and Danielle has over 4 years of office administrator experience. The suggestions provided are not an official audit, but rather suggestions based on experience to prepare the Church campus should an audit occur.

Roll Call – 33 out of 47 present (including new members that were welcomed prior to the meeting-14 new members in total (9 were present for ALCC))

Motion to Approve Minutes from 2023 ALCC- Motion made by Erik Stosz, seconded by Cindy Telfer. All approved.

Ministry Reports:

Childrens Ministry Report- Brittany Stoesz- Thank you to all assistants. Thank you to Mitch for repairs.

Assistant Pastor Report- Kim Spenard- Continuing education towards Master of Divinity through Wesleyan Seminary. Continuing to organize seasonal events to help our community in all the ways needed at the times needed.

Youth Pastor Report- Josh Guinn- Organized 14 youth events, and created a young adult team to help with events. Will continue to focus on building WKK staff and family relationships. Seeing where God is leading to know how to meet needs in each area.

Women's Ministry Report- Cindy Telfer- Creating a way to grow and get to really know ladies outside of church. Bible study, Women's Tea, other events. Welcoming new ladies to the ministry board to help plan future events.

Worship Ministry Report- Lyle Harms- Thanks to all the team for the passion and willingness to worship and being co-worshiper with the congregation. Amazing worship nights and special celebration events for Christmas and Easter went well. Continuing to introduce new songs and opportunities to worship.

WKK- Sara Wood- This year is a year of growth and sustainability. Thank you for your prayers, cards, and other donations. Please continue to pray and support the staff and families in any way possible.

Trustee Report- Mitch Fahland- Thank you for your trust and patience with repairs and future expansion plans.

Lead Pastor Report- Jareb Collins- Approaching our 5yr anniversary of being here. We are where God wants us. What it looks like to serve our community is a vision that supports our mission. How we do this is to equip families to grow closer to God and take that out and minister in the community. WKK is our biggest asset as far as reaching our community. We are actively seeking ways to serve at WKK and to build relationships with the teachers and families there. Looking at starting a small group in our home, willing to try new ways to revitalize our church

using some church planting approaches/techniques. Continuing to listen to God's voice for our church.

Men's Ministry Report- Jason Stoesz-Started back men's breakfast and weekly prayer and meetings, and monthly family prayer night. These have good turnouts with room for more!

Motion to approve all reports: Carrie Stonebarger made the motion to approve all the above reports. Erik Stosz seconded the motion. All approved.

Financials- Q&A:

1. WKK grants can't be in the proposed budget since they are not guaranteed, but they will continue to be pursued.
2. FCC income \$50,000 included additional donations not regular tithes and offerings, transfers from WIF to cover repairs.
3. How much in WIF? Appx \$600,000 (combined accounts), with the interest earned monies being used sparingly for repairs when needed.
4. Pastor's contingency fund came from personal donations to pay for pastor events/special speakers, etc.
5. Pastor pay increase does it include other staff raises? Yes and no, still exploring some other arrangements with staffing.

Motion to approve the WKK and FCC budgets made by Vaughn Telfer, seconded by Kelley Fahland. Motion approved.

Position Elections:

Board Secretary (2yr position): Only one nomination-Kelly Ehll, no nominations from the floor Carrie Stonebarger moved to accept Kelly Ehll through Unanimous vote of confidence. All approved.

Member at large (2yr position): (Rick Brown coming off), Nominations are: Doug Stonebarger and Bob Manes, (no nominations from the floor)

Elected by majority vote is Bob Manes

July 18-20, 2024-Conference Delegates Nominations: Charlie and Ruth Hoelscher and Carrie and Doug Stonebarger, no nominations from the floor.
