Reach Student Ministry

FCC KIDS

This past year has been a significant season of growth, discipleship, and intentional ministry within Kids Ministry. We are deeply grateful for the opportunity to invest weekly in the spiritual development of our children and to partner with families as we help raise the next generation to know and love Jesus.

Throughout the year, we have seen God's faithfulness in both the steady growth of our ministry and the meaningful ways children are engaging in their faith journey.

We maintained a consistent weekly attendance of 15–20 children, creating a safe, welcoming, environment where children engaged in biblical teaching, worship, crafts, hands-on activities, and relationship-building opportunities. Our lesson planning has continued to closely follow the themes and scriptures being taught in our main service, creating consistency for families. It has been so amazing to hear feedback from parents on discussions they are having at home.

A major milestone this year was the successful launch of **Kids Klub**, which expanded our ministry's reach beyond Sunday services and created a valuable midweek opportunity for discipleship, connection, and community building. We are now seeing **roughly 25 children attend each Thursday**, and it has become a meaningful way to continue teaching about Jesus beyond Sunday while providing consistent midweek ministry and encouragement for our families.

The opening of an additional classroom for our 2–4-year-olds has allowed us to further strengthen our ministry structure by separating age groups more effectively. This has created space for more intentional, age-appropriate discipleship

We introduced special events and themed experiences such as our Snow Cone Social and continued our 5th Sunday Movie and popcorn days which is always a big hit.

Our Christmas program was truly amazing this year, and it was such a special blessing to have the WKK elementary students join in as well. The kiddos worked incredibly hard learning their lines and songs, and I was beyond proud of each one of them. Watching their confidence grow and seeing them shine on stage was such joy. Honestly, it was one of the biggest highlights of my year.

One of the most encouraging areas of growth this year has been within our volunteer team. We have seen increased interest from individuals desiring to serve in Kids Ministry, we have 10 adult volunteers and 3 Teens who have been consistent and caring and we are so incredibly thankful for all they do to help run Kids Ministry.

As we look ahead, our vision is to continue building a ministry culture centered on discipleship, partnership, and sustainable growth.

We want to create clearer next steps for children to develop a personal relationship with Jesus and continue growing in biblical understanding and spiritual habits.

A major focus moving forward will be equipping parents with practical tools, communication, resources, and connection time that empower them to lead faith conversations beyond the church walls.

We will continue prioritizing volunteer recruitment, leadership development, and appreciation to ensure we are building a strong, sustainable ministry team for long-term growth.

We are sincerely grateful for the support of our church leadership, families, and volunteers. It is a privilege to steward this ministry and invest in the next generation. We remain expectant and full of faith for what God will continue to do in the year ahead through Kids Ministry.

FINANCIAL AUDIT

Financial Review Findings for September 2025

Family Community Church and Wesleyan Kiddie Kollege

On May 14, 2026, Angel Kuehn and Angela Burris completed a random review of the September 2025 financial records. The statements were found to be balanced, and the supporting documentation provided matched the corresponding bank statements, check stubs, deposit records, and receipts.

During the 2024 audit, several recommendations were made. With the exception of two minor items, all recommendations have since been implemented. We again recommend maintaining documentation for the Protect My Ministry charges and obtaining copies of bank check images, whether electronically or in paper form. Additionally, supporting documentation for the monthly AFLAC charges should be retained with the financial records.

Two minor documentation discrepancies were identified, both in favor of WKK. One involved a \$3 difference between an invoice amount and the amount reflected on the bank statement. The second involved a \$50 discrepancy related to a deposit. Although the variance was noted within the financial software, no correction was made to the supporting documentation; therefore, the deposit slip and bank statement amounts did not match.

Please note that neither Angel Kuehn nor Angela Burris are Certified Public Accountants (CPAs), nor are they employed by an accounting firm. Angel has more than 20 years of experience working in accounting roles for large companies, and Angela is a small business owner and office administrator. The observations and recommendations provided are not intended to constitute an official audit, but rather practical suggestions based on professional experience to help prepare the church campus should an official audit take place in the future.
